We have issued an unmodified opinion dated February 24, 2021, that states that the audited consolidated balance sheets as of December 31, 2020 and 2019, and the related consolidated statements of income, comprehensive income, members' equity and cash flows for the years then ended, present fairly, in all material respects, the consolidated financial position of the cooperative in conformity with accounting

principles generally accepted in the United States of America. The audited financial statements are available at the cooperative office in Missoula for inspection by members of the cooperative.

We also have the responsibility to report on various matters to the Board of Trustees that include any discovery of material errors, irregularities or possible illegal acts. We did not have any such findings in the course of our 2020 audit.


